## **Overview**

The Swedish parent company of SAAB was declared bankrupt in December 2011. SAAB Australia entered voluntary receivership in January 2013.

The international parts division of SAAB continues, with parts manufacture severely cut back, to a point where SAAB spares are described as in “shortage” and SAAB owners and repairers commonly having to resort to non-genuine, “after-market” parts.

Most of these parts are of Chinese origin and of varying quality.

Comparing web statements from SAAB preferred repairers with statements from non-endorsed SAAB repairers, the international SAAB parts distributors may be forcing non-endorsed repairers to rely on non-genuine parts, thus giving endorsed repairers a marketable edge.

Alternatively, there may be a genuine worldwide shortage of SAAB parts, affecting all repairers.

Repairers report that sourcing the best quality Chinese after-market parts suffices in repairing SAAB vehicles to manufacturer’s standards.

On August 31, 2012, Hong Kong company NEVS purchase the bankrupt estate of SAAB Sweden. It is reported that NEVS plans to resurrect the SAAB brand maintaining the SAAB edge in innovation, by releasing an electric propelled SAAB 9-3, in early 2014.

Looking ahead, accident and mechanical repairs of currently-owned SAAB vehicles will provide some limited demand for specialist, endorsed SAAB services.

However, the brighter light could well be the resurrection of the brand by NEVS, increasing the exposure and popularity of the SAAB brand, and quite probably, improving the availability of genuine and/or good quality after-market parts, made under more direct scrutiny in China.

The new SAAB entity under NEVS, appears to be upholding the SAAB tradition of engineering excellence, which could very likely result in a licence given on the Chinese mainland to produce genuine SAAB parts to the stringent standards SAAB has historically demanded.

With this as a likely scenario starting mid-2014, it would seem a good time to make enquiry of SAAB mid-2013, about becoming a SAAB-endorsed body repairer. There does not appear to be any specialist mechanical repairers in the Newcastle-Hunter region, and few in the northern suburbs of Sydney (Artarmon, Hornsby, Killara, North Parramatta). There does not appear to be any SAAB-endorsed body repairers in Sydney, Central Coast, Lake Macquarie, Newcastle or the Hunter regions.

The downside of applying for SAAB endorsement is, who to approach for endorsement? SAAB Australia, formerly officed in Melbourne, has now been closed.

This leaves the major SAAB genuine-parts distributor in Australia, SAAB Automobile Parts AB, as the main point of contact. There does not appear to be any physical presence for this company in Australia and the only point of contact is through an email facility at:

The other channel of opportunity to build a reputation as a SAAB body-repair specialist is through direct approach to the SAAB dealers and mechanical repair specialists, listed on the SAAB parts website.

This list can be found in the appendix.

Such a move to network with established SAAB dealers and repairers, places the Auto Body Repairer in a good position to be considered for official endorsement as a specialist SAAB repairer, once the SAAB brand is resurrected by NEVS in a year's time.

## **Conclusion**

It would appear to be something of a risk to enter into partnership with a company which has, for all intents and purposes, died the death by bankruptcy just a short time ago, particularly since their Australian presence has been removed as recently as just a few months.

However, the risk is not a particularly costly one, and should the future pan out as NEVS is anticipating, the connection with SAAB could reap decent rewards.

A marketing drive towards networking with current SAAB service providers in Sydney and Newcastle would seem to be the most sensible way forward.
